Job Description

Overall purpose of the role

To work alongside the lead worker and volunteers in delivering Jolly Soap Opera Mob activities and supporting the participation of club members in those activities.

- To support the club members in developing their abilities, reaching their potential, and moving towards independent living.
- To liaise with parents and carers regarding the development of the club.
- To be an advocate for the young adults and the work of The Orrell Trust.
- To support the setting up and setting down of the weekly sessions.
- To be aware of and work in line with all policies and procedures of The Orrell Trust.
- To attend training and professional development as required for the role.
